## Last Time We Met.

Greetings all and welcome to a New Year of Friend's activities. Our last get together was the Christmas party which, due to the hot weather, was held at the Anakie depot. We were presented with a copy of the Birds of the Long Forest by the Friends of Werribee Gorge for our library. As soon as I work out where our library is, I'll let you know. 2006 started badly, with the Brisbane Ranges fire starting just before Australia Day. Months of frustration followed until we were finally allowed back into the burnt areas of the park, with the final section between Anakie Gorge and Stony Creek being reopened on the day of the wildflower show. And what a show it was, with the burnt areas putting on a spectacular display of wildflowers, with the grass tree spikes towering over all.

2007 nearly started off on the same foot, with a fire in the Stieglitz Park, starting near the Bert Boardman Reserve almost a year to the day after the 2006 fire. The area burnt was relatively small (approx 160 ha) but 2 houses were burnt in the fire.

There are some obvious challenges to the Friends group in the year ahead as we continue to help Parks with the recovery of the Brisbane Ranges following the fire. Weeds are becoming more obvious as they take advantage of the bare ground and when the rain finally starts falling again it will only exacerbate the problem. There are some interesting opportunities coming up too, with a new coordinator for the VNPA Park Mates program being appointed. The Geelong Field Nats/Gordon Institute/DSE Brush-tailed Phascogale survey should also be gearing up and the Friends will be celebrating our 25<sup>th</sup> birthday in October. All in all, 2007 looks like it should be an agreeable year. See you in the park sometime.
